What is Growing Small?

One of the gifts that God is giving the Pillar community is the joy of growth: new families, new friends, new opportunities. In the midst of that growth, we want to remain a community where "your name is known, your story is heard and your questions are honored."

Those two things, growth and connection, can sometimes be at odds with one another. So, in 2020, we launched an initiative we call "Growing Small" to guide us through growth in such a way that we stay true to who we are. Growing Small is a way to celebrate and steward growth and live into the kind of connected community we want to be. A few years ago we started a second site called Pillar at the Warehouse.

This fall we will start a third site in the chapel at Western Theological Seminary. We intend to partner with Community Action House, which is an effort that serves a meal every Sunday morning at the seminary to food-insecure members of the West Michigan community.

When and where are the services?

11:00 AM on Sundays at Mulder Chapel at Western Theological Seminary (101 E 13th St, Holland, MI)

What will the services be like?

The chapel at WTS is a beautiful space for which is oriented "in the round" instead of a traditional Front-facing sanctuary. It provides an informal yet intimate environment for worship. One of the ways we are describing the worship for this site is *Reformed Anglican*. Which is a way of saying worship that holds the centrality of the Word in an expression that borrows the forms of the historic Christian faith, provides space for silence and contemplation, and *higher* liturgical expression, all while continuing to cultivate the creative liturgical life of the Pillar community as a whole.

What is the partnership with Community Action House?

We intend to partner with Community Action House, which is an effort that serves a meal every Sunday morning at the seminary to food-insecure members of the West Michigan community. This is not an effort to "get" folks from the breakfast to attend a worship service but rather an opportunity for worshippers with Pillar at the Chapel to engage the wider community by "knowing a name, hearing a story and honoring a question." Training will be provided for those who intend to attend the breakfast as well as those who hope to volunteer to serve the breakfast.

What is the Staff support for Pillar at the Chapel?

Chris Devos will serve as the primary Campus Host, and Emily Hanrahan will serve as Pastoral Musician to this worshipping community.

Who will preach?

The preaching focus will come from a preaching team primarily made up of Pastor Jon, Pastor Anna, Rev. Dr. Winn Collier and Dr. Wesley Hill.

Chris DeVos - Pillar Executive Pastor, Chris will be the primary campus host at Pillar's Western Chapel site.


SAMPLE ORDER OF WORSHIP

All: My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.


Song: My Help It Comes From You

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,


have mercy on us and forgive us;

to the glory of your Name.


